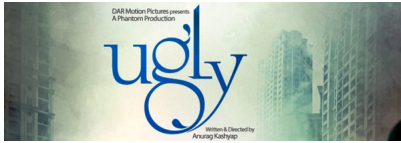


watch how TVF makes fun of Anurag Kashyap
